LHS students earn College Board AP[®] Scholar Awards

LEXINGTON. S.C. — The College Board's Advanced Placement Program[®] (AP[®]) recognizes 37 students at Lexington High School, who earned AP Scholar Awards in recognition of their exceptional achievement on AP Exams.

The College Board's AP Program[®] provides motivated and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams. The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP Exams.

Eighteen LHS students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on five or more of these exams.

Seventeen students qualified for the AP Scholar with Honor Award by earning an average grade of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and grades of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

Eighteen students qualified for the AP Scholar Award by completing three or more AP Exams with grades of 3 or higher.

Of this year's award recipients at LHS, fifteen are sophomores or juniors. These students have at least one more year in which to complete college-level work and possibly earn a higher-level AP Scholar Award.
