Teacher Vacancies

At this time, we have 10 core certified vacancies. All schools have an alternative plan in place (ex: collapsing a class until second semester, utilizing a long term substitute,etc.) and are fully ready to open school with students next week. We have 2 open school counselor positions that we are still working to fill. Our district Director of Counseling is working to ensure those schools are supported.

The Special Services division is working through approximately 10 special education certified positions and has a plan in place to ensure students receive services.

INSTRUCTIONAL SERVICES

Band and Orchestra Instruments

Middle and high schools are on a five-year rotation cycle to replace band and orchestra instruments. Last year, GMS, GHS, and PHS assessed their needs and some replacement instruments were ordered. PHS placed a sizable order that should be in soon after school begins this year. Until then, the district is assisting with arrangements for borrowed equipment from other schools.



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Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading and Spelling (LETRS) Update

CSES, GES, LES LMES, and RBES have been selected to participate in the first LETRS® cohort which will begin this fall. The state budget includes funding for K-3 teachers, school administrators, reading coaches, reading interventionists and K-3 special education teachers to participate in LETRS® training. Several of our schools are also including 4th and 5th grade teachers in the training. LETRS® will strengthen teachers' knowledge of language structure, including phonology, syllable types, morphology, spelling generalizations, semantics and syntax and show how each correlates with the development of the reading brain to produce skilled, proficient readers. We are excited to begin this learning journey in Lexington One!

OPERATIONS & STUDENT SERVICES



"For the first time in history, each public school in Lexington County has a permanently assigned school resource officer, 39 of whom are Lexington County deputies. This is a landmark accomplishment that has taken a lot of work and cooperation from all the law enforcement agencies and the five school districts across Lexington County," Sheriff Jay Koon said. Bus Driver Vacancies

Last August we had 32 regular-route driver vacancies. Currently we have 27 vacancies. We have 6 driver applicants awaiting the next class, and the transportation staff is actively processing additional applications. Our area supervisors are coordinating routes and double routing where it is necessary in order to provide the safest and most efficient transportation schedule possible.
