
Teacher Recruitment Fair - January 21st

SUPERINTENDENT

Gov. McMaster released his executive budget. A copy is linked here so you will see his direction for the State and education.

McMaster Executive Budget:

Of particular note, the proposed budget includes \$3.6 million recurring and non-recurring general funds for the creation of the Center for School Safety and Targeted Violence at the State Law Enforcement Division (SLED). As Chief Mark Keel shared at our November 15 board meeting, this new center will provide extensive training, education and expertise in the fields of school safety and targeted violence. The explanation of the center in the budget proposal notes that SLED is working with the Lexington School District One to acquire the rights to use the building and property that was previously Gilbert Elementary School to locate this statewide training facility. This Executive Budget includes \$986,941 in recurring general funds for the personnel and operating costs of the Center and \$2,607,900 in non-recurring funds to acquire use of the property and to purchase equipment and training simulators for the Center.
